Yes. NY State of Health's Essential Plan coverage includes comprehensive reproductive health services.

## What benefits are covered?

The Essential Plan covers the following reproductive health benefits\*:

- Birth Control
- Emergency Contraception
- Abortion
- Sterilization
- Testing and Treatment for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)
- HIV Testing
- Preventive Care and Well-Woman Examinations
- Infertility Treatment
- Pregnancy Tests

\*Coverage may be subject to certain medical criteria, which may be determined by your provider.

## How much does it cost?

The **cost of these benefits** varies by Essential Plan level, but services are either free or low-cost.



The Essential Plan Reproductive Health Benefits	
Reproductive Health Benefit Category	Benefits Covered
Birth Control	Includes pills, intrauterine device (IUD), Depo Provera, Norplant, and other contraceptive forms, as well as select over-the-counter contraceptive products as prescribed by a provider. Also includes patient education and counseling on their use, follow up services, and device insertion and removal. Beginning in late 2024 pharmacists are authorized to dispense birth control over the counter under a standing order from a physician or nurse practitioner.
Emergency Contraception	Includes emergency contraception prescribed by a doctor, such as an IUD or Ella, or over-the-counter emergency contraception at a pharmacy.
Abortion	Includes coverage of abortion.
Sterilization	Includes sterilization procedures for women and vasectomies for men.
Testing and Treatment for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)	Includes testing methods, such as colposcopy, and treatment methods such as cryotherapy and antibiotics.
HIV Testing	Includes testing as well as pre-test and post-test counseling.
Preventive Care and Well-Woman Examinations	Includes pap smears, testing for cervical cancer, pelvic problems, breast disease, anemia, and high blood pressure screening among others.
Infertility Treatment	Includes initial evaluation and analysis, such as laboratory evaluation and pelvic ultrasound, as well as medically appropriate treatment of ovulatory dysfunction. Fertility Preservation services may be covered in the case of impairment of fertility due to surgery, radiation, chemotherapy or other medical treatment affecting reproductive organs or processes. Advanced infertility services are not covered.
Pregnancy Tests	Includes blood-based pregnancy test as ordered by a doctor. Does not cover over-the-counter tests.
