Yes. Qualified Health Plans available through NY State of Health includes comprehensive reproductive health services.

What benefits are covered?

Qualified Health Plans cover the following reproductive health benefits*:

- Birth Control
- Emergency Contraception
- Abortion
- Sterilization
- Testing and Treatment for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)
- HIV Testing
- Preventive Care and Well-Woman Examinations
- Infertility Treatment
- Maternity and Newborn Care
- Inpatient Stay for Maternity Care

How much does it cost?

<u>Pricing</u> is dependent on your Qualified Health Plan level, and many covered services may be available at low or no-cost.

Reproductive Health Benefits for Qualified Health Plan Enrollees

Qualified Health Plan Reproductive Health Benefits	
Reproductive Health Benefit Category	Benefits Covered
Birth Control	Includes pills, intrauterine device (IUD), Depo Provera, Norplant, and other contraceptive forms as prescribed by a provider as well as patient education and counseling on their use. Beginning in late 2024 pharmacists are authorized to dispense birth control over the counter under a standing order from a physician or nurse practitioner.
Emergency Contraception	Includes emergency contraception prescribed by a doctor, such as an IUD or Ella, or over-the-counter emergency contraception at a pharmacy.
Abortion	Includes coverage of abortion.
Sterilization	Includes sterilization procedures for women and vasectomies for men.
Testing and Treatment for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)	Includes testing methods, such as colposcopy, and treatment methods such as cryotherapy and antibiotics.
HIV Testing	Includes testing as well as pre-test and post-test counseling.
Preventive Care and Well-Woman Examinations	Includes routine gynecological care, breast exam, annual cervical cancer screening.
Preventive Breast Cancer Care	Includes mammograms, screening, and diagnostic imaging for the detection of breast cancer.
Infertility Treatment	Includes the diagnosis and treatment (surgical and medical) of infertility. Basic, comprehensive, and advanced infertility treatment services may be covered as deemed medically necessary.
