

# Congressional District 11 Fact Sheet: Unwinding the Public Health Emergency

Important changes are coming. New federal rules will require New York State to begin redetermining eligibility for public program enrollees in the Spring of 2023. Enrollees in Medicaid, Child Health Plus and the Essential Plan have not had to renew their health insurance since early 2020 due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) continuous coverage requirements.

In Spring 2023, NY State of Health will begin sending renewal notices to enrollees in these programs. Each month between May 2023 and April 2024, a group of enrollees will receive their renewal notices, depending on their enrollment end date. **Renewal notices will include their deadline to take action to renew their insurance or risk having a gap in coverage.**

## In Congressional District 11:

**97,118** gained coverage throughout the PHE.

There are currently **263,045** individuals in Congressional District 11 enrolled in Medicaid, Child Health Plus and the Essential Plan through NY State of Health.

## Key Steps Your Constituents Can Take To Prepare

### Sign up to receive text alerts from NY State of Health

Text "START" to 1-866-988-0327 to receive important updates about their health insurance, like when they need to renew. Constituents can sign up for text alerts in Spanish by texting "INICIAR" to the same number.

### Provide NY State of Health with updated contact information

Constituents should keep their address, phone number, and email address up to date to help ensure renewal information sent by NY State of Health reaches them. They can update their contact information in the following ways:

- By calling NY State of Health at 1-855-355-5777 (TTY: 1-800-662-1220)

If a constituent is enrolled in Medicaid through their county's Medicaid office or through New York City's Human Resources Administration, they should contact that office to update their address and contact information.

Michelle received her renewal notice in the mail. Her notice stated she must take action and renew by a specific date.



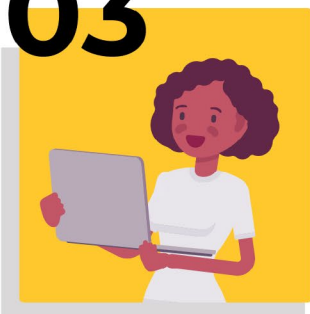
