Legal Authority

We are sending you this notice in accordance with 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 155.545.

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Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you were eligible for the Essential Plan, effective January 1, 2017?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were not eligible for Medicaid?

Procedural History

On December 8, 2016, you updated your application for financial assistance. That day, a preliminary eligibility determination was prepared stating that you were eligible for the Essential Plan, effective January 1, 2017.

Also on December 8, 2016, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed your eligibility determination insofar as you were determined not eligible for Medicaid.

On December 9, 2016, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination, based on the December 8, 2016 application, stating that you were eligible for the Essential Plan for a limited time, effective January 1, 2017. That notice also stated that you were not eligible for Medicaid, because your income was over the allowable income limit for that program. You were asked to submit documentation confirming your household's income before March 8, 2017.

On March 9, 2017, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. During the hearing, your mother acted

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as your authorized representative and assisted you in your testimony. The record was developed during the hearing and held open to March 24, 2017, to allow you to submit a letter from your former employer and paystubs from December 2016.

As of March 24, 2017, the Appeals Unit did not receive any documents from you and none were viewable in your NYSOH account. However, a letter from your employer dated March 21, 2017 was viewable in your account as of March 25, 2017 (). That letter will be marked as Appellant's Exhibit #1 and incorporated into the record. The record is now closed.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2017 taxes with a tax filing status of single. You will claim no dependents on that tax return.
- Your application states that you will not be taking any deductions on your 2017 tax return.
- 3) You are seeking insurance for yourself.
- 4) The application that was submitted on December 8, 2016 listed annual household income of \$17,992.00, consisting of income you earn from your employment. You testified that this amount was correct at the time of the application.
- 5) You testified, but did not provide documentation, that your monthly income for December 2016 was \$1,277.00.
- 6) You testified that your employment ended on January 20, 2017.
- 7) A letter from the count and viewable on March 21, 2017, was uploaded to you NYSOH account and viewable on March 25, 2017, confirming that your last day of employment was January 20, 2017.
- 8) You testified that you are not currently working.
- 9) You testified that your current income is \$0.00.
- 10) Your application states that you live in County.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present noncitizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

In an analysis of Essential Plan eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL in effect on the first day of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$11,880.00 for a one-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036.).

A person who has a household income that is at or below 150% of the FPL has a \$0.00 premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 21, as approved January 2016; see https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program.html).

A person who has a household income greater than 150% of the FPL or below 200% of the FPL has a \$20.00 per month premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, as approved January 2016).

The Essential Plan is considered minimum essential coverage therefore, a person who is eligible for the Essential Plan is not eligible for any premium tax credit because they are eligible for minimum essential coverage through the individual market (see 26 CFR § 1.36B-2(c)(1), 26 USC § 5000A(f)(1)(C)).

Medicaid

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

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In an analysis of Medicaid eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL "for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility" (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$11,880.00 for a one-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

Legal Analysis

The first issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were eligible for the Essential Plan, effective January 1, 2017.

You are in a one-person household. You expect to file your 2017 income taxes as single and will claim no dependents on that tax return.

The application that was submitted on December 8, 2016 listed an annual household income of \$17,992.00 and the eligibility determination relied upon that information.

The Essential Plan is provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$11,880.00 for a one-person household. Since an annual household income of \$17,992.00 is 151.45% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be eligible for the Essential Plan.

The second issue is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were ineligible for Medicaid.

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults between the ages of 19 and 65 who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$11,880.00 for a one-person household. Since \$17,992.00 is 151.45% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for Medicaid on an expected annual income basis, using the information provided in your application.

However, financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size.

You testified that you earned \$1,277.00 in December 2016 but did not provide any proof of income as requested by the Hearing Officer.

To be eligible for Medicaid, you would need to meet the non-financial criteria and have an income no greater than 138% of the FPL, which is \$1,367.00 per month. Since you did not provide documentation to support your testimony, NYSOH Appeals Unit declines to analyze your eligibility for Medicaid in the month of December 2016 based on monthly income.

Since the December 9, 2016 eligibility determination properly stated that, based on the information you provided, you were eligible for the Essential Plan and ineligible for Medicaid, it is correct and is AFFIRMED.

During the hearing, you testified that your employment and income situation has changed since submitting your December 8, 2016 application. You testified that your employment ended on January 20, 2017 and you provided a letter from , dated March 21, 2017 confirming that your last day of employment was January 20, 2017.

Therefore, your case is RETURNED to NYSOH to verify the income documentation submitted (accordingly) and redetermine your eligibility accordingly.

Decision

The December 9, 2016 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

Your case is RETURNED to NYSOH to verify the income documentation submitted () and redetermine your eligibility accordingly.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

NYSOH properly determined you to be eligible for the Essential Plan effective January 1, 2017.

NYSOH properly determined you to be ineligible for Medicaid.

Your case is being sent back to NYSOH to verify the income documentation you provided.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
