Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you were eligible to receive up to \$193.00 per month in advance payments of the premium tax credit, effective March 1, 2017?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were eligible for cost-sharing reductions?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were not eligible for the Essential Plan?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were not eligible for Medicaid?

Procedural History

On January 10, 2017, you submitted an application for financial assistance. Also on that date, you submitted four paystubs.

On January 11, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice stating that additional information was required to confirm your eligibility. You were directed to produce income documentation for your household by January 3, 2017.

On January 19, 2017, your income documentation was verified and an application was run on your behalf.

On January 20, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination stating that you were eligible to receive up to \$193.00 in APTC and eligible to receive cost-sharing reductions if you enrolled in a silver level qualified health plan, effective March 1, 2017. That notice also stated that you were not eligible for Medicaid or the Essential Plan because your income was over the allowable income limits for those programs.

On January 26, 2017, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed the amount of financial assistance you were eligible to receive, and requested that your eligibility be redetermined.

On April 20, 2017, you were scheduled for a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeal Unit. You requested that the hearing be adjourned to a later date.

On April 25, 2017, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. You The record was developed during the hearing and held open up to May 10, 2017, to allow you to submit supporting documents.

On May 10, 2017, NYSOH's Appeals Unit received a fax containing four paystubs. No other documentation was received, and the record was closed at the end of business that day.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2017 taxes with a tax filing status of single. You will claim one dependent on that tax return.
- 2) You are seeking insurance for yourself.
- 3) The application that was submitted on January 10, 2017 listed annual household income of \$12,000.00, consisting of income you earn from your employment. You testified that your earnings vary from paycheck to paycheck, and that you anticipate earning around \$30,000.00.
- 4) You submitted a total of four paystubs:
 - a. dated December 16, 2016 for a gross \$736.94
 - b. dated December 23, 2016 for a gross \$563.11
 - c. dated December 30, 2016 for a gross \$750.87
 - d. dated January 6, 2017 for a gross \$1,000.88

- 5) On January 19, 2017, NYSOH verified the paystubs as sufficient proof of income, and calculated an annual expected income of \$39,673.40, which is an average of the four paystubs (\$762.95) multiplied by 52 weeks.
- 6) You testified that you work in a restaurant and are required to tip out other employees. You do not believe the amount you are required to tip out should be included in your earnings.
- 7) Your paystubs list "Tips (Out)" as a deduction, but include "Tips" and "TipsCharge" in your gross taxable income. "Tips" and "Tips (Out)" are the same amount on each of the four paystubs you submitted.
- 8) You testified that your 2016 tax return would not be an accurate representation of your income because it did not consider any earnings that you were required to tip out.
- 9) You testified that you are paid weekly and your income varies from week to week. You stated that December and January are busier months, so you earn more in those months.
- 10) Your application states that you will not be taking any deductions on your 2017 tax return.
- 11) Your application states that you live in Westchester County.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Advance Payments of Premium Tax Credit

Advance payments of the premium tax credit (APTC) are generally available to a person who is eligible to enroll in a qualified health plan (QHP) and (1) expects to have a household income between 138% and 400% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL), (2) expects to file a tax return and claim a personal exemption deduction for a person who meets the eligibility requirements to enroll in a QHP, and (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market (see 45 CFR § 155.305(f), 42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)).

The maximum amount of APTC that can be authorized equals:

 the cost of the health insurance premium for the taxpayer's coverage family in the second lowest cost silver plan offered through NY State of Health in the county where the taxpayer resides

minus

2) the taxpayer's expected contribution amount

(see 26 USC § 36B, 26 CFR § 1.36B-3).

The taxpayer's expected contribution amount is the amount that the taxpayer is expected to spend on health insurance premiums. The expected contribution for 2017 is set by federal law at 2.04% to 9.69% of household income (26 USC § 36B(b)(3)(A), 26 CFR § 1.36B-3T(g)(1), IRS Rev. Proc.2016-24).

In an analysis of APTC eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR §§ 155.300(a), 155.305(f)(1)(i)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$16,020.00 for a two-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036.).

For annual household income in the range of at least 200% but less than 250% of the 2016 FPL, the expected contribution is between 6.43% and 8.21% of the household income (26 CFR § 1.36B-3T(g)(1), 45 CFR § 155.300(a), IRS Rev. Proc. 2016-24).

People who use the APTC to help pay health insurance premiums must file a federal tax return and reconcile their expected income (stated on NYSOH application) with their actual income (stated on their federal income tax return). Those who take less tax credit in advance than they claim on the tax return may get the rest of it as an income tax refund or have their tax bill reduced. Those who take more tax credit in advance than they can claim on their tax return will owe the difference as additional income taxes (26 CFR § 1.36B-4).

Cost-Sharing Reductions

Cost-sharing reductions (CSR) are available to a person who (1) is eligible to enroll in a QHP through NYSOH, (2) meets the requirements to receive APTC, (3) is expected to have an annual household income that does not exceed 250% of the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested, and (4) is enrolled in a silver-level QHP (45 CFR § 155.300(a), 45 CFR § 155.305(g)(1)).

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present noncitizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

In an analysis of Essential Plan eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL in effect on the first day of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$16,020.00 for a two-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036.).

A person who has a household income that is at or below 150% of the FPL has a \$0.00 premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 21, as approved January 2016; see https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program.html).

A person who has a household income greater than 150% of the FPL or below 200% of the FPL has a \$20.00 per month premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, as approved January 2016).

The Essential Plan is considered minimum essential coverage therefore, a person who is eligible for the Essential Plan is not eligible for any premium tax credit because they are eligible for minimum essential coverage through the individual market (see 26 CFR § 1.36B-2(c)(1), 26 USC § 5000A(f)(1)(C)).

Medicaid

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

In an analysis of Medicaid eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL "for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility" (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$16,020.00 for a two-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

Modified Adjusted Gross Income

NYSOH bases its eligibility determinations on modified adjusted gross income as defined in the federal tax code (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). The term "modified adjusted gross income" means adjusted gross income increased by (1) any income that was excluded under 26 USC § 911 for United States citizens or residents living abroad, (2) tax-exempt interest received or accrued, and (3) Social Security benefits that were excluded from gross income under 26 USC § 86 (see 26 USC § 36B(d)(2)(B), 26 CFR § 1.36B-1(e)(2)).

"Adjusted gross income" means, in the case of an individual taxpayer, gross federal taxable income minus certain specific deductions, such as expenses reimbursed by an employer, losses from sale or exchange of property, losses from premature withdrawal of finds from time savings accounts, deductions attributable to royalties, and certain retirement savings (26 USC § 62(a)). Living expenses, such as rent and utilities are not an allowable deduction in computing adjusted gross income.

Legal Analysis

The first issue is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were eligible for an APTC of up to \$193.00 per month.

The application that was submitted on January 19, 2017 listed an annual household income of \$39,673.40 and the eligibility determination relied upon that information. This income was calculated based on the gross earnings as listed on your paystubs by taking an average of the four weekly paystubs and multiplying by 52 weeks.

"Adjusted gross income" means, in the case of an individual taxpayer, gross federal taxable income minus certain specific deductions, as noted above. You did not provide any documentation to support your testimony that the amount that you tip out should be excluded from your gross earnings. Furthermore, you testified that the amount you tip out is included in the gross earnings on your federal tax return. Therefore, NYSOH properly calculated your expected annual gross income based on the total gross pay as stated on the paystubs you provided.

You are in a two-person household. You expect to file your 2017 income taxes as single and will claim one dependent on that tax return.

You reside in Westchester County, where the second lowest cost silver plan available for an individual through NYSOH costs \$461.49 per month.

An annual income of \$39,673.40 is 247.65% of the 2016 FPL for a two-person household. At 247.65% of the FPL, the expected contribution to the cost of the health insurance premium is 8.13% of your income, or \$268.79 per month.

The maximum amount of APTC that can be approved equals the cost of the second lowest cost silver plan available through NYSOH for an individual in your county (\$461.49 per month) minus your expected contribution (\$268.79 per month), which equals \$192.70 per month. Therefore, rounding to the nearest dollar, NYSOH correctly determined you to be eligible for up to \$193.00 per month in APTC.

The second issue is whether you were properly found eligible for cost-sharing reductions. Cost-sharing reductions are available to a person who has a household income no greater than 250% of the FPL. Since a household income of \$39,673.40 is 247.65% of the applicable FPL, NYSOH correctly found you to be eligible for cost sharing reductions.

The third issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were not eligible for the Essential Plan.

The Essential Plan is provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$16,020.00 for a two-person household. Since an annual household income of \$39,673.40 is 247.65% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be not eligible for the Essential Plan.

The fourth issue is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were not eligible for Medicaid.

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults between the ages of 19 and 65 who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$16,020.00 for a two-person household. Since \$39,673.40 is 247.65% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be not eligible for Medicaid on an expected annual income basis, using the information provided in your application.

However, financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size.

You submitted four paystubs that shows that between December 16, 2016 and January 6, 2017, you received \$3,051.80.

To be eligible for Medicaid, you would need to meet the non-financial criteria and have an income no greater than 138% of the FPL, which is \$1,387.00 per month. Since the documentation you provided is insufficient to calculate your income for January 2017, you do not qualify for Medicaid on the basis of monthly income as of the date of your application.

Since the January 20, 2017 eligibility determination properly stated that, based on the information provided, you were eligible for up to \$193.00 per month in APTC, eligible for cost-sharing reductions, not eligible for the Essential Plan and not eligible for Medicaid, it is correct and is AFFIRMED.

You testified that your earnings vary week to week, and that your earnings in December and January are not indicative of your annual income. You also testified that you expect to earn around \$30,000.00 in 2017. However, you did not provide sufficient documentation regarding your income for January 2017 or to support an annual gross income of \$30,000.00, and your eligibility cannot be redetermined based on your testimony alone. If you can produce sufficient documentation regarding your earnings in January 2017 or expected annual income, please submit it to NYSOH within 30 days of this Decision. In the alternative, if the information in your application is not correct, please update your application accordingly.

Decision

The January 20, 2017 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

You remain eligible for up to \$193.00 in APTC.

NYSOH properly determined you to be eligible for cost-sharing reductions.

NYSOH properly determined you to be not eligible for the Essential Plan.

NYSOH properly determined you to be not eligible for Medicaid.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
