## Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you were eligible to receive up to \$296.00 per month in advance payments of the premium tax credit (APTC), effective June 1, 2017?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were eligible for cost-sharing reductions?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were not eligible for the Essential Plan?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were not eligible for Medicaid?

## Procedural History

On April 12, 2017, you submitted an updated application for financial assistance.

On April 13, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium for a limited time, effective May 1, 2017. The notice further directed you to submit documentation of your income by July 3, 2017.

Also on April 13, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of enrollment confirmation, confirming your enrollment in an Essential Plan, beginning May 1, 2017.

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That same day, you uploaded income documentation to your NYSOH account.

On April 17, 2017, NYSOH reran your application for financial assistance.

On April 18, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination stating that you were eligible to receive up to \$296.00 per month in APTC, and eligible for cost-sharing reduction if you enrolled in a silver level qualified health plan (QHP), effective June 1, 2017. The notice also stated that you were not eligible for the Essential Plan or Medicaid because your income was over the allowable income limit for those programs.

Also on April 18, 2017, NYSOH issued a disenrollment notice stating that you were disenrolled from your Essential Plan coverage, effective May 31, 2017, because you were no longer eligible to remain enrolled in that coverage.

On April 25, 2017, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed the April 18, 2017 eligibility determination notice, insofar as you were not eligible for a higher level of financial assistance. You also requested Aid to Continue, pending the outcome of your appeal.

On April 29, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium for a limited time, effective June 1, 2017. This was because you were granted Aid to Continue, pending the outcome of the appeal.

Also on April 29, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of enrollment confirmation stating that you were enrolled in an Essential Plan 1, effective June 1, 2017. This was also pursuant to your request for Aid to Continue.

On August 4, 2017, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. The record was developed during the hearing and held open through August 21, 2017 to allow you time to submit documentation of your income for the month of July 2017.

As of August 22, 2017, no documents were received by the Appeals Unit of NYSOH, and your NYSOH account did not reflect that any documentation had been uploaded after the hearing. Therefore, the record is now closed.

## **Findings of Fact**

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2017 taxes with a tax filing status of single. You will claim no dependents on that tax return.

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- 2) On April 13, 2017, you uploaded four weekly paystubs to your NYSOH account, for the following dates and gross income amounts:
  - a. March 8, 2017: \$576.80 (Document [REDACTED]);
  - b. March 15, 2017: \$543.84 (Document [REDACTED]);
  - c. March 22, 2017: \$461.44 (Document [REDACTED]);
  - d. March 29, 2017: \$461.44 (Document [REDACTED]).
- 3) NYSOH calculated your annual household income to be \$25,565.76, and based the April 18, 2017 eligibility determination on this calculation.
- 4) You testified that this income could be correct, if you remain at your job for the rest of the year.
- 5) You testified that you are employed in a temporary position. You testified that you have been at the position for a year and expect the position to continue for some time, but cannot say with certainty when it will end, or whether it will last until the end of the year.
- 6) You testified that you earn \$16.35 an hour, you believe, and work 35 hours per week.
- 7) The paystubs you uploaded on April 13, 2017 show an hourly pay rate of \$16.48.
- 8) You testified that you were paying for medical insurance coverage and life insurance coverage through your employer, but that you stopped paying for medical insurance coverage shortly after the date of the last paystub you submitted.
- 9) Your application states that you will not be taking any deductions on your 2017 tax return.
- 10) Your application states that you live in [REDACTED].
- 11) You testified you cannot afford the premium payments for coverage, even with APTC.
- 12) You testified that you do not get paid if you are sick or there is a holiday, and you are looking for more financial assistance with the cost of your health insurance.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

## Applicable Law and Regulations

### Advance Payments of Premium Tax Credit

APTC are generally available to a person who is eligible to enroll in a QHP and (1) expects to have a household income between 138% and 400% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL), (2) expects to file a tax return and claim a personal exemption deduction for a person who meets the eligibility requirements to enroll in a QHP, and (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market (see 45 CFR § 155.305(f), 42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)).

The maximum amount of APTC that can be authorized equals:

- 1) the cost of the health insurance premium for the taxpayer's coverage family in the second lowest cost silver plan offered through NY State of Health in the county where the taxpayer resides

*minus*

- 2) the taxpayer's expected contribution amount

(see 26 USC § 36B, 26 CFR § 1.36B-3).

The taxpayer's expected contribution amount is the amount that the taxpayer is expected to spend on health insurance premiums. The expected contribution for 2017 is set by federal law at 2.04% to 9.69% of household income (26 USC § 36B(b)(3)(A), 26 CFR § 1.36B-3T(g)(1), IRS Rev. Proc.2016-24).

In an analysis of APTC eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR §§ 155.300(a), 155.305(f)(1)(i)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$11,880.00 for a one-person household (81 Federal Register 4036).

For annual household income in the range of at least 200% but less than 250% of the 2016 FPL, the expected contribution is between 6.43% and 8.21% of the household income (26 CFR § 1.36B-3T(g)(1), 45 CFR § 155.300(a), IRS Rev. Proc. 2016-24).

People who use the APTC to help pay health insurance premiums must file a federal tax return and reconcile their expected income (stated on NYSOH application) with their actual income (stated on their federal income tax return). Those who take less tax credit in advance than they claim on the tax return may get the rest of it as an income tax refund or have their tax bill reduced. Those

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who take more tax credit in advance than they can claim on their tax return will owe the difference as additional income taxes (26 CFR § 1.36B-4).

### Cost-Sharing Reductions

Cost-sharing reductions are available to a person who (1) is eligible to enroll in a QHP through NYSOH, (2) meets the requirements to receive APTC, (3) is expected to have an annual household income that does not exceed 250% of the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested, and (4) is enrolled in a silver-level QHP (45 CFR § 155.300(a), 45 CFR § 155.305(g)(1)).

### Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable FPL or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present non-citizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

In an analysis of Essential Plan eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL in effect on the first day of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$11,880.00 for a one-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036).

A person who has a household income that is at or below 150% of the FPL has a \$0.00 premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 21, as approved January 2016; see <https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program/basic-health-program.html>).

A person who has a household income greater than 150% of the FPL or below 200% of the FPL has a \$20.00 per month premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, as approved January 2016).

The Essential Plan is considered minimum essential coverage therefore, a person who is eligible for the Essential Plan is not eligible for any premium tax credit because they are eligible for minimum essential coverage through the individual market (see 26 CFR § 1.36B-2(c)(1), 26 USC § 5000A(f)(1)(C)).

### Medicaid

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Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

In an analysis of Medicaid eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL “for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility” (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$12,060.00 for a one-person household (82 Fed. Reg. 8831).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

## **Legal Analysis**

The first issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were eligible for an APTC of up to \$296.00 per month.

Based on income documentation you uploaded on April 13, 2017, NYSOH calculated your expected annual income to be \$26,565.76.

You testified that this will be approximately correct if you remain at your current job for the remainder of the year, but that you work at a temporary position, and you do not know with certainty when it will end. You testified that you do not get paid when you do not work or when there is a holiday. You testified that you have been in your current temporary position for a year. The record was left open so that you could submit recent income documentation; however, none was submitted. Therefore, your eligibility is based on the \$26,565.76 expected annual income figure.

You are in a one-person household. You expect to file your 2017 income taxes as single and will claim no dependents on that tax return.

You reside in [REDACTED], where the second lowest cost silver plan available for an individual through NYSOH costs \$456.46 per month.

An annual income of \$26,565.76 is 223.62% of the 2016 FPL for a one-person household. At 223.62% of the FPL, the expected contribution to the cost of the health insurance premium is 7.27% of income, or \$160.94 per month.

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The maximum amount of APTC that can be approved equals the cost of the second lowest cost silver plan available through NYSOH for an individual in your county (\$456.46 per month) minus your expected contribution (\$160.94 per month), which equals \$295.52 per month. Therefore, rounding to the nearest dollar, NYSOH correctly determined you to be eligible for up to \$296.00 per month in APTC, based on the income documentation you provided.

The second issue under review is whether you were properly found eligible for cost-sharing reductions. Cost-sharing reductions are available to a person who has a household income no greater than 250% of the FPL. Since a household income of \$26,565.76 is 223.62% of the applicable FPL, NYSOH correctly found you to be eligible for cost sharing reductions.

The third issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were ineligible for the Essential Plan, as of April 6, 2017.

The Essential Plan is provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$11,880.00 for a one-person household. Since an annual household income of \$26,565.76 is 223.62% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for the Essential Plan.

The fourth issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were ineligible for Medicaid.

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults between the ages of 19 and 65 who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$12,060.00 for a one-person household. Since \$26,565.76 is 220.28% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for Medicaid on an expected annual income basis, based on the income documentation you provided.

Since the April 18, 2017 eligibility determination properly stated that, based on the information you provided, you were eligible to receive up to \$296.00 per month in APTC, eligible for cost-sharing reductions, ineligible for the Essential Plan and ineligible for Medicaid, it is correct and is AFFIRMED.

## **Decision**

The April 18, 2017 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

## **How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility**

You remain eligible for up to \$296.00 in APTC.

You are eligible for cost-sharing reductions.

You are ineligible for the Essential Plan.

You are ineligible for Medicaid.

If your income changes, you may update your NYSOH application at any time to have your eligibility redetermined.

## **If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)**

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
