#### Issue

The issue presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health is:

Did NY State of Health properly determine that your child was eligible to enroll in Child Health Plus at full cost, effective August 1, 2017?

## Procedural History

On June 22, 2017, NY State of Health (NYSOH) received your updated application for health insurance. That day, a preliminary eligibility determination was prepared stating that your child was eligible to enroll in a Child Health Plus (CHP) plan at full cost.

Also on June 22, 2017, you spoke to the NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed the preliminary eligibility determination, insofar as your child was not eligible for CHP premium assistance.

On June 23, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination notice, based on your June 22, 2017 application, stating that your child was eligible to enroll in a CHP plan at full cost, effective August 1, 2017.

Also on June 22, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of enrollment confirmation, confirming your child's enrollment in a CHP plan at full cost, effective August 1, 2017.

On June 27, 2017, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that your child was eligible to enroll in a CHP plan with a \$45.00 monthly premium, for

a limited time, effective August 1, 2017. This was because you had been granted Aid to Continue until a decision was made on your appeal.

Also on June 27, 2017, NYSOH issued a plan enrollment notice confirming your child's enrollment in their CHP Plan with a \$45.00 monthly premium, effective August 1, 2017.

On September 15, 2017, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. The record was developed during the hearing and closed at the end of the hearing.

## **Findings of Fact**

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2017 tax return with a tax filing status of married filing jointly. You will claim your child as a dependent on that tax return.
- 2) The application that was submitted on June 22, 2017 listed annual household income of \$95,000.00, consisting of \$80,000.00 you earn in income from employment, and \$15,000.00 your spouse earns in income from her employment. You testified that you believe this amount was correct.
- 3) You testified that your spouse is a specified and has just gone back to work after having your child, so you are unsure as to what she will actually make this year.
- 4) You testified that you do not plan to take any deductions on your 2017 tax return.
- 5) As of the date of your June 22, 2017 application, your child was
- 6) Your application states that you live in
- 7) You testified that you would like to be eligible for financial assistance with the cost of your child's CHP coverage because although your expected household income has increased a little this year, so has your household expenses; which include daycare expenses and other household expenses.
- 8) You testified that your spouse may be pregnant soon, but as of the date of hearing, you were unsure as to whether your spouse was pregnant.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

## **Applicable Law and Regulations**

#### Child Health Plus

CHP is a sliding-scale-premium program for children who are in a household that is over income for regular Medicaid (see New York Public Health Law (NY PHL) § 2510 et seq. and 42 USC § 1397aa). Eligibility rules are set out in NY PHL § 2511(2), as well as in the NYS Department of Health 2008-2012 Contract and Plan Manual.

A child who meets the eligibility requirements for CHP may be eligible to receive a subsidy payment if the child resides in a household with a household income at or below 400% of the federal poverty level (FPL) (NY PHL § 2511(2)(a)(iii)). To be eligible to enroll in CHP with subsidy payments, a child must not be "eligible for medical assistance"; that is, must not be eligible for Medicaid (NY PHL § 2511(2)(b)).

The amount of the premium payment, if any, that must be made on behalf of a child who enrolls in a CHP plan depends upon the child's family household income (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)). No payments are required for eligible children whose family household income is less than 160% of the FPL (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(1)). If the family household income is 160% or higher, premiums range from \$9.00 per month to \$60.00 per month (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)).

The CHP premium is \$9.00 per month for a child whose family household income is between 160% and 222% of the FPL, but no more than \$27.00 per month per family (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(ii)).

The CHP premium is \$15.00 per month for a child whose family household income is between 223% and 250% of the FPL, but no more than \$54.00 per month per family (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(iii)).

The CHP premium is \$30.00 per month for a child whose family household income is between 251% and 300% of the FPL, but no more than \$90.00 per month per family (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(iv)).

The CHP premium is \$45.00 per month for a child whose family household income is between 301% and 350% of the FPL, but no more than \$135.00 per month per family (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(v)).

The CHP premium is \$60.00 per month for a child whose family household income is between 351% and 400% of the FPL, but no more than \$180.00 per family (NY PHL § 2510(9)(d)(vi)).

In an analysis of Child Health Plus eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL "for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility" (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$16,240.00 for a two-person household (82 Federal Register 8831).

## **Legal Analysis**

The issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that your child was eligible to enroll in CHP at full cost, effective August 1, 2017.

According to the record, you expect to file your 2017 federal income tax return as married filing jointly, and to claim your one child as a dependent. Therefore, your child is in a three-person household.

In your June 22, 2017 application, you attested to an expected household income of \$95,000.00; which consists of \$80,000.00 you earn in income from your employment, and \$15,000.00 your spouse earns in income from her employment.

During the hearing, you testified that the amount you provided in your application was correct. However, you asked that your current expenses, which include daycare expenses and other living expenses, be considered when calculating your annual household income.

Since the Internal Revenue Service rules do not allow living expenses such as daycare expenses, and other household expenses to be deducted from the calculation of your adjusted gross income, they cannot be deducted when the NYSOH computes your modified adjusted gross income for CHP premium assistance purposes. Therefore, NYSOH correctly determined your household income to be \$95,000.00.

A child is eligible to enroll in CHP with premium assistance if they meet the non-financial requirements, are not eligible for Medicaid, and have a household income below 400% of the FPL. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$20,420.00 for a three-person household. Since \$95,000.00 is 465.23% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH properly found your child to be eligible for CHP at full cost, and to be ineligible for any CHP premium assistance.

Therefore, the June 23, 2017 eligibility determination notice properly stated that, based on the information you provided, your child was eligible to enroll in a CHP plan at full cost, effective August 1, 2017, and is AFFIRMED.

#### **Decision**

The June 23, 2017 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

## **How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility**

Your child remains eligible for CHP at full cost.

Your child is not eligible for CHP premium assistance.

## If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
