Legal Authority

We are sending you this notice in accordance with 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 155.545.

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Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health properly determine that you were eligible for the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium, effective December 1, 2017?

Did NY State of Health properly determine that you were not eligible for Medicaid?

Procedural History

On October 25, 2017, you updated your application for financial assistance. That day, a preliminary eligibility determination was prepared stating that you were eligible for the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium, effective December 1, 2017.

Also on October 25, 2017, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed the eligibility determination insofar as you were not eligible for Medicaid.

On October 26, 2017, NY State of Health (NYSOH) issued a notice of eligibility determination, based on the October 25, 2017 application, stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium, effective December 1, 2017. That notice also stated that you were not eligible for Medicaid because your income was over the allowable income limit for that program.

On November 3, 2017, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating you were eligible for Medicaid, for a limited time, effective December 1, 2017. This was because you were granted Aid to Continue until a decision was made on your appeal. You subsequently were reenrolled into a Medicaid Managed Care plan, effective December 1, 2017.

On December 21, 2017, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. The record was developed during the hearing and held open until January 5, 2017, to allow you time to submit supporting documents. Also on December 21, 2017, the requested documentation was uploaded to your NYSOH account. That documentation was incorporated into the record as Appellant's Exhibit #1 and the record closed thereafter.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2017 taxes with a tax filing status of head of household. You will claim three dependents on that tax return.
- 2) You testified this appeal involves your coverage only.
- 3) You submitted an updated application on October 25, 2017 listing your annual household income as \$37,500.00, consisting solely of income from your employment. You testified that this amount was correct.
- 4) NYSOH calculated your average monthly household income as \$3,125.00.
- 5) You testified, and provided documentation, that your monthly income for October 2017 was \$3,461.68.
- 6) You testified that your income fluctuates every month based on commission.
- 7) Your application states that you will not be taking any deductions on your 2017 tax return. However, you testified and provided documentation that you intend to claim a tuition and fees deduction of \$2,278.00.
- 8) Your application states that you live in Suffolk County.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present noncitizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

In an analysis of Essential Plan eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL in effect on the first day of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). On the date of your application, that was the 2016 FPL, which is \$24,300.00 for a four-person household (81 Fed. Reg. 4036.).

A person who has a household income that is at or below 150% of the FPL has a \$0.00 premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 21, as approved January 2016; see https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program.html).

A person who has a household income greater than 150% of the FPL or below 200% of the FPL has a \$20.00 per month premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, as approved January 2016).

The Essential Plan is considered minimum essential coverage therefore, a person who is eligible for the Essential Plan is not eligible for any premium tax credit because they are eligible for minimum essential coverage through the individual market (see 26 CFR § 1.36B-2(c)(1), 26 USC § 5000A(f)(1)(C)).

Modified Adjusted Gross Income

NYSOH bases its eligibility determinations on modified adjusted gross income as defined in the federal tax code (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). The term "modified adjusted gross income" means adjusted gross income increased by (1) any income that was excluded under 26 USC § 911 for United States citizens or residents living abroad, (2) tax-exempt interest received or accrued, and (3) Social Security benefits that were excluded from gross income under 26 USC § 86 (see 26 USC § 36B(d)(2)(B), 26 CFR § 1.36B-1(e)(2)).

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"Adjusted gross income" is the gross income of the taxpayer minus the deductions permitted (26 USC § 62). However, the law that allowed for a deduction from adjusted gross income of up to \$4,000.00 in tuition and fees paid by the taxpayer during the tax year to a qualified educational institution has not yet been renewed for the 2017 tax year (26 USC § 222(e), H.R. 2029, passed December 18, 2015).

Medicaid

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

In an analysis of Medicaid eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL "for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility" (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$24,600.00 for a four-person household (82 Fed. Reg. 8831).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

Legal Analysis

The first issue is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were eligible for the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium, effective December 1, 2017.

You testified that you expect to file your 2017 taxes with a tax filing status of head of household. You will claim three dependents on that tax return. Therefore, you are in a four-person household.

You submitted an updated application on October 25, 2017 listing your annual household income as \$37,500.00, consisting solely of income from your employment. The eligibility determination relied on this information.

The Essential Plan is provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$24,300.00 for a four-person household. Since an annual household income of \$37,500.00 is 154.32% of the 2016 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be eligible for the Essential Plan. Since your household income is greater than 150% of the FPL a \$20.00 per month premium contribution was properly determined.

The second issue is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were ineligible for Medicaid.

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults between the ages of 19 and 65 who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$24,600.00 for a four-person household. Since \$37,500 is 152.44% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for Medicaid on an expected annual income basis, using the information provided in your application.

However, financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size.

You submitted documentation that shows in October 2017 you received \$3.461.68.

To be eligible for Medicaid, you would need to meet the non-financial criteria and have an income no greater than 138% of the FPL, which is \$2,050.00 per month. Since the documentation you provided shows that you earned \$3,461.68 in October 2017 you do not qualify for Medicaid on the basis of monthly income as of the date of your application.

Since the October 26, 2017 eligibility determination properly stated that, based on the information you provided, you were eligible for the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 monthly premium and ineligible for Medicaid, it is correct and is AFFIRMED.

During the hearing, you credibly testified and provided documentation that you intend to claim tuition and fees deduction of \$2,278.00 on your 2017 tax return. However, the tuition and fees deduction has yet to be renewed for the 2017 tax year and thus this amount cannot be deducted from your annual household income for the purposes of determining your eligibility for financial assistance.

Decision

The October 26, 2017 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

NYSOH properly found you are eligible for the Essential Plan based on the information you provided in your October 25, 2017 application.

NYSOH properly found you are ineligible for Medicaid.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
