Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that your oldest child (child) was eligible for \$0.00 of advance payments of the premium tax credit, effective January 1, 2018?

Did NYSOH properly determine that your child was not eligible for cost-sharing reductions?

Did NYSOH properly determine that your child was not eligible for the Essential Plan?

Did NYSOH properly determine that your child was not eligible for Medicaid?

Did NYSOH properly determine that your child was not eligible for Child Health Plus?

Procedural History

On November 22, 2017, you updated your children's application for financial assistance. That day, a preliminary eligibility determination was prepared stating that your child was eligible for advance payments of the premium tax credit of \$0.00 per month, and your youngest child was eligible for Child Health Plus for a cost of \$30.00 per month, effective January 1, 2018.

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Also on November 22, 2017, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed the start date of your youngest child's Child Health Plus plan.

On November 23, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination, based on the November 22, 2017 application, stating your oldest child (child) was eligible for advance payments of the premium tax credit of \$0.00 per month, and your youngest child was eligible for Child Health Plus for a cost of \$30.00 per month, effective January 1, 2018.

On January 30, 2018, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. During your hearing, you withdrew your appeal of your youngest child's Child Health Plus plan start date. You were allowed to amend your appeal to that of your child's eligibility for advance payments of the premium tax credit of \$0.00 per month. The record was developed during the hearing and closed at the end of the proceeding.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you expect to file your 2018 income tax return with a tax filing status of head of household. You will claim two dependents on that tax return.
- 2) You are seeking insurance for your oldest child (child) in that you want him to be found eligible for Child Health Plus.
- 3) Your child [REDACTED] on [REDACTED].
- 4) The application that was submitted on November 22, 2017, listed an annual household income of \$55,000.00 you earn from your one employment. You testified that this amount was correct.
- 5) Your application states that you will not be taking any deductions on your 2017 tax return.
- 6) Your application states that you and your children live in [REDACTED], NY.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Advance Payments of Premium Tax Credit

Advance Payments of the Premium Tax Credit (APTC) are generally available to a person who is eligible to enroll in a qualified health plan and (1) expects to have a household income between 138% and 400% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL), (2) expects to file a tax return and claim a personal exemption deduction for a person who meets the eligibility requirements to enroll in a qualified health plan, and (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market (see 45 CFR § 155.305(f), 26 CFR § 1.36B-2, 42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)).

The maximum amount of APTC that can be authorized equals:

- 1) the cost of the health insurance premium for the taxpayer's coverage family in the second lowest cost silver plan offered through NY State of Health in the county where the taxpayer resides

minus

- 2) the taxpayer's expected contribution amount

(see 26 USC § 36B, 26 CFR § 1.36B-3).

The taxpayer's expected contribution amount is the amount that the taxpayer is expected to spend on health insurance premiums. The expected contribution for 2018 is set by federal law at 2.01% to 9.56% of household income (26 USC § 36B(b)(3)(A), 26 CFR § 1.36B-3, IRS Rev. Proc. 2017-36).

In an analysis of APTC eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR §§ 155.300(a), 155.305(f)(1)(i)). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$20,420.00 for a three-person household (82 Federal Register 8831).

For annual household income in the range of at least 250% but less than 300% of the 2018 FPL, the expected contribution in 2018 is between 8.1% and 9.56% of the household income (26 CFR § 1.36B-3(g)(1), 45 CFR § 155.300(a), IRS Rev. Proc. 2017-36).

People who use the APTC to help pay health insurance premiums must file a federal tax return and reconcile their expected income (stated on NYSOH application) with their actual income (stated on their federal income tax return). Those who take less tax credit in advance than they claim on the tax return may

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get the rest of it as an income tax refund or have their tax bill reduced. Those who take more tax credit in advance than they can claim on their tax return will owe the difference as additional income taxes (26 CFR § 1.36B-4).

Cost-Sharing Reductions

Cost-sharing reductions (CSR) are available to a person who (1) is eligible to enroll in a QHP through NYSOH, (2) meets the requirements to receive APTC, (3) is expected to have an annual household income that does not exceed 250% of the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested, and (4) is enrolled in a silver-level QHP (45 CFR § 155.300(a), 45 CFR § 155.305(g)(1)).

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable FPL or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present non-citizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

In an analysis of Essential Plan eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL in effect on the first day of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$20,420.00 for a three-person household (82 Fed. Reg. 8831).

A person who has a household income that is at or below 150% of the FPL has a \$0.00 premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 21, as approved January 2016; see <https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program/downloads/ny-blueprint.pdf>).

A person who has a household income greater than 150% of the FPL or below 200% of the FPL has a \$20.00 per month premium contribution (New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, as approved January 2016).

Medicaid

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State

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plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

In an analysis of Medicaid eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL “for the applicable budget period used to determine an individual's eligibility” (42 CFR § 435.4). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$20,420.00 for a three-person household (82 Fed. Reg. 8831).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

Child Health Plus

A child under the age of nineteen may be eligible for subsidized coverage through Child Health Plus provided (1) he or she lives in a household having a household income at or below 400% of the FPL; (2) is not eligible for medical assistance; (3) is not eligible for coverage under the public employees' state health benefits plan, and (4) is a resident of New York State (NY Public Health Law § 2511(2)(a-e)).

The “period of eligibility” for Child Health Plus is “that period commencing on the first day of the month during which a child is an eligible child and enrolled or recertified for enrollment on an annual basis based on all required information and documentation and ending on the last day of the twelfth month following such date,” unless the premiums are not timely paid or the child no longer resides in New York State, gains access to or obtains other health insurance coverage, reaches the age of 19 or becomes eligible for Medicaid (NY Public Health Law § 2510(6)).

Children who “age out” of Child Health Plus are disenrolled from the health plan on the last day of the month in which they reach 19 years of age (see e.g. State Plan Amendment (SPA) NY-14-0005, approved February 3, 2015 and effective January 1, 2014, 42 CFR § 457.350).

Household Size

In the case of an individual who expects to be claimed as a tax dependent by another taxpayer for the taxable year in which an initial determination or renewal of eligibility is being made, the household size is the same as the taxpayer claiming such individual as a tax dependent (42 CFR § 435.603(f)(2)).

Legal Analysis

The first issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that your child was eligible for \$0.00 of APTC, effective January 1, 2018.

The application that was submitted on November 22, 2017 listed an annual household income of \$55,000.00 and the eligibility determination relied upon that information.

Your child is in a three-person household. This is because you expect to file your 2018 income tax return as head of household and will claim two dependents on that tax return. Your child expects to be claimed as a tax dependent by you for the taxable year. Therefore, his household is the same size as yours.

You reside in Queens County, where the second lowest cost silver plan available for a child through NYSOH costs \$210.10 per month.

An annual income of \$55,000.00 is 269.34% of the 2017 FPL for a three-person household. At 269.34% of the FPL, the expected contribution to the cost of the health insurance premium for your child in 2018 is 8.66% of income, or \$396.91 per month.

The maximum amount of APTC that can be approved equals the cost of the second lowest cost silver plan available through NYSOH for an individual in your county (\$210.10 per month) minus your expected contribution (\$396.91 per month). Since your expected monthly contribution of \$396.91 is more than what the second lowest cost silver plan for a child is in your county (\$210.10), your child would be ineligible to receive APTC payments.

Therefore, NYSOH properly determined your child was eligible for \$0.00 of APTC, effective January 1, 2018.

The second issue under review is whether your oldest child was properly determined ineligible for cost-sharing reductions. Cost-sharing reductions are available to a person who has a household income no greater than 250% of the FPL. Since a household income of \$55,000.00 is 269.34% of the applicable FPL, NYSOH correctly found your child to be ineligible for cost-sharing reductions.

The third issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined your oldest child was ineligible for the Essential Plan.

The Essential Plan is generally provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$20,420.00 for a three-person household. Since an annual household income of \$55,000.00 is 269.34%

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of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH correctly found your child ineligible for the Essential Plan.

The fourth issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that your child was ineligible for Medicaid.

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults between the ages of 19 and 65 who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. On the date of your application, the relevant FPL was \$20,420.00 for a three-person household. Since \$20,420.00 is 269.34% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH properly found your oldest child to be ineligible for Medicaid on an expected annual income basis, using the information provided in your application.

However, financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size. The record reflects your child was not receiving Medicaid benefits at the time of your November 22, 2017 application.

Based on your application submitted on November 22, 2017, you reported an annual household income of \$55,000.00. Therefore, you expect to earn an average monthly income of \$4,583.33.

To be eligible for Medicaid, your child would need to meet the non-financial criteria and have an income no greater than 138% of the FPL, which is \$2,349.00 per month. Since your annual income as averaged over a twelve-month period is \$4,583.33, which exceeds the maximum allowable monthly income amount, your child would not qualify for Medicaid based on monthly income.

The fifth issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined your child was not eligible for Child Health Plus, effective January 1, 2018.

In your November 22, 2017 application, you stated that your child is [REDACTED]. NYSOH relied upon this information. The record reflects that your child [REDACTED] on [REDACTED].

A child is eligible to enroll in Child Health Plus if they meet the non-financial requirements, are not eligible for Medicaid, and have a household income below 400% of the FPL. One of the non-financial criteria is that a child must be under 19 years of age when they are in receipt of Child Health Plus.

Your child's eligibility was redetermined on November 22, 2017, and was to be effective January 1, 2018. As of January 1, 2018, your child was [REDACTED]. As a result, he was no longer eligible for Child Health Plus.

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Since the November 23, 2017 eligibility determination notice properly stated that, based on the information you provided, your child was eligible for \$0.00 in APTC, ineligible for cost-sharing reductions, ineligible for the Essential Plan, ineligible for Medicaid, and ineligible for Child Health Plus, it is correct and is AFFIRMED.

Decision

The November 23, 2017 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

Your child was eligible for APTC at \$0.00 per month, effective January 1, 2018.

Your child was properly determined to be ineligible for cost-sharing reductions.

Your child was properly determined to be ineligible for the Essential Plan.

Your child was properly determined to be ineligible for Medicaid.

Your child was properly determined to be ineligible for Child Health Plus.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

If applicable, if you think a portion of your appeal should not be dismissed, you can ask us to vacate, or cancel, this dismissal. You must ask us in writing within 30 days after the date on this notice, showing good cause as to why the dismissal should be vacated. NYSOH's Appeals Unit will review your request. If your request is approved, another hearing will be scheduled for you. If your request is denied, NYSOH will tell you in writing. If you do not respond to the dismissed portion of your appeal within 30 days, your appeal will remain dismissed, and NYSOH will take no further action on your appeal.

Insofar as your case was decided, the Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

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Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
