Issue

The issue presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health is:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you were not eligible to enroll in health insurance coverage through NYSOH?

Procedural History

On January 3, 2018, you submitted an application for financial assistance through NYSOH. Based on that application, NYSOH rendered a preliminary eligibility determination stating that you were not eligible for health insurance coverage.

Also on January 3, 2018, you contacted NYSOH's Account Review Unit and requested an appeal insofar as you were determined not eligible for financial assistance or to purchase health insurance through NYSOH.

On January 4, 2018, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice, based on your January 3, 2018 application, stating that you were not eligible for Medicaid because your household income exceeded the income threshold. Further, you were not eligible for the Essential Plan, tax credits, or enroll in a qualified health plan because verification documents showed that you were not lawfully present.

On March 9, 2018, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. Testimony was taken during the hearing and the record was fully developed during the hearing. The record was closed at the end of the hearing.

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Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you want to be determined eligible to enroll in health insurance through NYSOH.
- 2) According to your January 3, 2018 application and your testimony, you expect to file a 2018 federal income tax return with the tax status of single and do not expect to claim any dependents on that return.
- 3) According to your January 3, 2018 application, you attested that you expect your annual household income to be \$23,703.68.
- 4) According to your January 3, 2018 application, you attested that your average monthly income is the same as your current monthly income.
- 5) According to your January 3, 2018 application, you did not expect to claim any deductions on your federal income tax return.
- 6) According to your NYSOH account, you are an immigrant non-citizen.
- 7) According to your U.S. Employment Authorization card, your category code is C33 with an expiration date of [REDACTED] (see Document [REDACTED]; uploaded 01/02/2018).
- 8) You testified that your immigration status has not changed.
- 9) The status of C-33, according to the United States Customs and Immigration Services (USCIS) and Social Security Administration (SSA) is in reference to a status classified as Deferred Action on Childhood Arrivals.
- 10) According to your account, you reside in [REDACTED], New York.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present non-

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citizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

Qualified Health Plan/Essential Plan – Citizenship and Immigration Status

To enroll in a qualified health plan (QHP) through the Marketplace, an applicant must be a citizen or national of the United States or a non-citizen who is lawfully present in the United States and reasonably expects to become a citizen or remain a lawfully present noncitizen for the entire period for which enrollment is being sought (45 CFR § 155.305(a)(1); 45 CFR § 155.20; 42 CFR § 600.305; 42 CFR § 600.5).

The federal regulations state that the following non-citizens are lawfully present:

- (1) A qualified alien as defined in section 431 of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act (PRWORA) (8 U.S.C. 1641);
- (2) An alien in nonimmigrant status who has not violated the terms of the status under which he or she was admitted or to which he or she has changed after admission;
- (3) An alien who has been paroled into the United States pursuant to section 212(d)(5) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA) (8 U.S.C. 1182(d)(5)) for less than 1 year, except for an alien paroled for prosecution, for deferred inspection or pending removal proceedings;
- (4) An alien who belongs to one of the following classes:
 - (i) Aliens currently in temporary resident status pursuant to section 210 or 245A of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1160 or 1255a, respectively);
 - (ii) Aliens currently under Temporary Protected Status (TPS) pursuant to section 244 of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1254a), and pending applicants for TPS who have been granted employment authorization;
 - (iii) Aliens who have been granted employment authorization under 8 CFR 274a.12(c)(9), (10), (16), (18), (20), (22), or (24);
 - (iv) Family Unity beneficiaries pursuant to section 301 of Public Law 101-649 as amended;

- (v) Aliens currently under Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) pursuant to a decision made by the President;
 - (vi) Aliens currently in deferred action status;
 - (vii) Aliens whose visa petitions have been approved and who have a pending application for adjustment of status;
- (5) A pending applicant for asylum under section 208(a) of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1158) or for withholding of removal under section 241(b)(3) of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1231) or under the Convention Against Torture who has been granted employment authorization, and such an applicant under the age of 14 who has had an application pending for at least 180 days;
- (6) An alien who has been granted withholding of removal under the Convention Against Torture; or
- (7) A child who has a pending application for Special Immigrant Juvenile status as described in section 101(a)(27)(J) of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(27)(J));
- (8) *Exception.* An individual with deferred action under the Department of Homeland Security's deferred action for childhood arrivals process, as described in the Secretary of Homeland Security's June 15, 2012, memorandum, shall not be considered to be lawfully present with respect to any of the above categories in paragraphs (1) through (7) of this definition.

(45 CFR § 152.2).

Medicaid – Citizenship/Immigration Status

Medicaid must be provided to a United States citizen, a naturalized citizen, a qualified alien, and persons permanently residing in the United States under permanently residing under color of law (PRUCOL), is eligible for medical assistance from the state (42 CFR § 435.406; NY Soc. Serv. Law § 122(1); 18 NYCRR § 360-3.2(j)).

A PRUCOL alien is a person who is residing in the United States with the knowledge and permission or acquiescence of the federal immigration agency and whose departure from the United States such agency does not contemplate enforcing (18 NYCRR §360-3.2(j)). The New York Department of Health regards aliens who have been issued an Employment Authorization Document (I-688B or I-766), and have the requisite category code, to be PRUCOL (08 OHIP/INF-4, dated August 4, 2008)).

The guide, “Key to I-766/I-688B, Employment Authorization Documents (EADs)”, defines certain codes on the USCIS Employment Authorization Documents” (08 MA/033, dated December 1, 2008, and as amended). It confirms that a person who has category code of “(c)(33)” has PRUCOL status for Medicaid and Child Health Plus only (*id.*).

Medicaid – Financial Eligibility

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

On the date of your application, that was the 2018 FPL, which is \$12,140.00 for a one-person household (83 Federal Register 2642).

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants who are not currently receiving Medicaid benefits is based on current monthly household income and family size (42 CFR § 435.603(h)(1); State Plan Amendment (SPA) 13-0055-MM3, as approved March 19, 2014).

Legal Analysis

The issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were not eligible to enroll in health insurance coverage through NYSOH.

On January 4, 2018, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that you were not eligible for Medicaid because your household income exceeded the income threshold. Further, you were not eligible for the Essential Plan, tax credits, or enroll in a qualified health plan because verification documents showed that you were not lawfully present.

Federal regulations require that a person seeking enrollment in the Essential Plan or a qualified health plan must be a citizen of the United States or have a satisfactory immigration status.

The record reflects that you attested that you are an immigrant non-citizen and submitted your employment authorization card as proof of your immigration status. Your employment authorization card reflects that your current category code is C33, and you testified that your status has not changed.

Individuals with deferred action under the Department of Homeland Security's deferred action for childhood arrivals process are not considered to be "lawfully present." Since your status does not meet the definition of lawfully present, for the purposes of obtaining coverage in the Essential Plan or a qualified health plan, NYSOH correctly determined you to be ineligible to enroll in those coverages based on your immigration status.

NY State has recognized persons with Deferred Action status within the accepted meaning of "*PRUCOL alien*," even though the federal government has not. The New York Court of Appeals ruled, in *Aliessa, et al. v. Novello* (96 NY 2d 418 [2001]), that New York must provide state-funded Medicaid to the lawfully residing immigrants who had been excluded from access to the federal Medicaid program. Since your current Deferred Action status does confer PRUCOL status for individuals seeking Medicaid eligibility, your eligibility is contingent on whether they meet the financial criteria for Medicaid.

The record reflects that you expected to file your 2018 federal income tax return with the tax status of single and did not expect to claim any dependents on that tax return. Therefore, you are in a one-person household for purposes of this analysis.

Adults are eligible for Medicaid if they meet the non-financial criteria and have a household modified adjusted gross income that falls at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size. The relevant FPL was \$12,140.00 for a one-person household.

According to your January 3, 2018 application, you attested to a yearly income of \$23,703.68. Since \$23,703.68 is 195.25% of the 2018 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for Medicaid, since your household's income exceeded the allowable income threshold.

Accordingly, the January 4, 2018 eligibility determination notice properly found you to be ineligible to enroll in the Essential Plan or QHP based on your immigration status, and ineligible for Medicaid based on your household's expected annual household income.

The January 4, 2018, eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

Decision

The January 4, 2018, eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

You are not eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan or a QHP based on your immigration status.

You are not eligible for Medicaid because your household income is over the maximum allowable income limit.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
