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Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you were eligible to receive up to \$320.00 per month in advance payments of the premium tax credit (APTC)?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were eligible for cost-sharing reductions (CSR)?

Did NYSOH properly determine that you were ineligible to enroll in the Essential Plan?

Procedural History

On December 29, 2017, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan with a \$20.00 premium per month for a limited time, effective February 1, 2018. The notice instructed you to submit proof of income by March 28, 2018, to confirm your eligibility.

Also on December 29, 2017, NYSOH issued a plan enrollment notice confirming that as of December 28, 2017, you were enrolled in an Essential Plan with an enrollment start date of February 1, 2018.

On January 22, 2018, additional income documentation was uploaded to your NYSOH account (see Document

Also on January 22, 2018, your NYSOH account was updated.

On January 23, 2018, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that you were eligible for a tax credit up to \$320.00 per month and CSR, effective March 1, 2018. The notice also stated that you were no longer eligible for the Essential Plan because your income was above the income limit for the program.

Also on January 23, 2018, NYSOH issued a disenrollment notice stating that your Essential Plan coverage would end as of February 28, 2018, because you were no longer eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan.

On January 29, 2018, you spoke with NYSOH's Account Review Unit and requested an appeal relative to the amount of financial assistance you were determined eligible to receive.

On March 30, 2018, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. Testimony was taken and the record was fully developed during the hearing. The record was closed at the end of the hearing.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) According to your NYSOH account and testimony, you expect to file a 2018 federal income tax return with the tax status of Head of Household (with qualifying individual), and expect to claim your dependent on that tax return.
- 2) On January 22, 2018, you submitted two earnings statements from your employer, . According to the statements, you were issued \$1,307.69 in federal taxable wages each on December 22, 2017 and January 5, 2018 (see Document
- You testified that your federal taxable wages in your biweekly statements were consistent.
- 4) You testified that you spend \$700.00 in dependent care expenses.
- 5) You testified that you began paying student loan payments in February 1, 2018, and that you pay \$68.00 per month.
- 6) You testified that you did not know how much of your monthly student loan payment is applied to the interest on the loan.

7) According to your NYSOH account, you reside in

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than

Applicable Law and Regulations

Modified Adjusted Gross Income

the evidence noted above.

NYSOH bases its eligibility determinations on modified adjusted gross income as defined in the federal tax code (45 CFR § 155.300(a)). The term "modified adjusted gross income" means adjusted gross income increased by (1) any income that was excluded under 26 USC § 911 for United States citizens or residents living abroad, (2) tax-exempt interest received or accrued, and (3) Social Security benefits that were excluded from gross income under 26 USC § 86 (see 26 USC § 36B(d)(2)(B), 26 CFR § 1.36B-1(e)(2)).

"Adjusted gross income" means, in the case of an individual taxpayer, gross federal taxable income minus certain specific deductions, such as expenses reimbursed by an employer, losses from sale or exchange of property, losses from premature withdrawal of finds from time savings accounts, deductions attributable to royalties, and certain retirement savings (26 USC § 62(a)).

Subject to income limitations, there shall be allowed as a deduction from the adjusted gross income, an amount not to exceed \$2,500.00, equal to the interest paid by the taxpayer during the taxable year on any qualified education loan (26 USC § 221; IRS Publication 970 (2017)).

Child and dependent care expense payments may be claimed on Line 49 of Form 1040; however, these expenses are not used to compute adjusted gross income (26 USC § 21; Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Publication 503 (2017)).

Household Composition

For APTC and CSR, the household size equals the number of individuals for whom the taxpayers are allowed a deduction under 26 USC § 151 for the taxable year, which typically includes: (1) the taxpayer, (2) his or her spouse, and (3) any claimed dependents (26 USC § 36B(d)(1)).

Advance Payments of Premium Tax Credit

Advance payments of the premium tax credit (APTC) are generally available to a person who is eligible to enroll in a qualified health plan (QHP) and (1) expects to have a household income between 138% and 400% of the applicable federal

poverty level (FPL), (2) expects to file a tax return and claim a personal exemption deduction for a person who meets the eligibility requirements to enroll in a QHP, and (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market (see 45 CFR § 155.305(f), 42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)).

The maximum amount of APTC that can be authorized equals:

1) the cost of the health insurance premium for the taxpayer's coverage family in the second lowest cost silver plan offered through NY State of Health in the county where the taxpayer resides

minus

2) the taxpayer's expected contribution amount

(see 26 USC § 36B, 26 CFR § 1.36B-3).

The taxpayer's expected contribution amount is the amount that the taxpayer is expected to spend on health insurance premiums. The expected contribution for 2018 is set by federal law at 2.01% to 9.56% of household income (26 USC § 36B(b)(3)(A), 26 CFR § 1.36B-3, IRS Rev. Proc. 2017-36).

In an analysis of APTC eligibility, the determination is based on the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested (45 CFR §§ 155.300(a), 155.305(f)(1)(i)). On the date of your application, that was the 2017 FPL, which is \$16,240.00 for a two-person household (82 Fed. Reg. 8831).

For annual household income in the range of at least 200% but less than 250% of the 2017 FPL, the expected contribution is between 6.34% and 8.10% of the household income (26 CFR § 1.36B-3(g)(1), 45 CFR § 155.300(a), IRS Rev. Proc. 2017-36).

People who use the APTC to help pay health insurance premiums must file a federal tax return and reconcile their expected income (stated on NYSOH application) with their actual income (stated on their federal income tax return). Those who take less tax credit in advance than they claim on the tax return may get the rest of it as an income tax refund or have their tax bill reduced. Those who take more tax credit in advance than they can claim on their tax return will owe the difference as additional income taxes (26 CFR § 1.36B-4).

Cost-Sharing Reductions

Cost-sharing reductions (CSR) are available to a person who (1) is eligible to enroll in a QHP through NYSOH, (2) meets the requirements to receive APTC,

(3) is expected to have an annual household income that does not exceed 250% of the FPL for the first day of the open enrollment period of the benefit year for which coverage is requested, and (4) is enrolled in a silver-level QHP (45 CFR § 155.300(a), 45 CFR § 155.305(g)(1)).

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present noncitizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

Affordability Exemption

Under some circumstances, a person may receive an exemption from paying a penalty for not purchasing health insurance coverage. Such an exemption may be granted if that person can show that he or she experienced a financial hardship or has domestic circumstances that (1) caused an unexpected increase in essential expenses that prevented that person from obtaining health coverage under a QHP; (2) would have caused the person to experience serious deprivation of food, shelter, clothing, or other necessities, as a result of the expense of purchasing health coverage under a QHP; or (3) prevented that person from obtaining coverage under a QHP (45 CFR § 155.605(a), (g)).

NY State of Health has deferred to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on the matter of hardship exemptions (see 45 CFR § 155.505(c)).

Legal Analysis

The first issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were eligible for up to \$320.00 of APTC per month.

On January 22, 2018, you submitted your December 22, 2017 and January 5, 2018 biweekly earnings statements from your employer. The statements reflected that you were issued \$1,307.69 in federal taxable wages each (see Document). Based on the documentation

submitted, your expected household income was calculated to be (\$1,307.69 X 26 biweekly periods) \$33,999.94.

For an individual who expects to file a federal income tax return, the household equals the taxpayers and the number of individuals for whom the taxpayer is claiming as a dependent.

You attested that you expect to file a 2018 federal income tax return, with the tax status of Head of Household (with qualifying individual), and expected to claim your child as a dependent on that return. Therefore, you are in a two-person household for purposes of this analysis.

You reside in Bronx County, New York, where the second lowest cost silver plan available for an individual through NYSOH costs \$509.30 per month.

An annual income of \$33,999.94 is 209.36% of the 2017 FPL for a two-person household. At 209.36% of the 2017 FPL, the expected contribution in 2018 is 6.67% of the household income, or \$188.98 per month.

The maximum amount of APTC that can be approved equals the cost of the second lowest cost silver plan available through NYSOH for an individual in your county (\$509.30 per month) minus your expected contribution (\$188.98 per month), which equals \$320.32 per month. Therefore, rounding to the nearest dollar, NYSOH correctly determined you to be eligible for up to \$320.00 per month in APTC.

The second issue under review is whether you were properly found eligible for CSR.

CSR are available to a person who has a household income no greater than 250% of the 2017 FPL. Since a two-person household with an income of \$33,999.94 is 209.36% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH correctly found you to be eligible for CSR.

The third issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you were ineligible for the Essential Plan.

The Essential Plan is provided through NYSOH to individuals who meet the non-financial requirements and have a household modified adjusted gross income that is between 138% and 200% of the FPL for the applicable family size. Since an annual household income of \$33,999.94 is 209.36% of the 2017 FPL, NYSOH properly found you to be ineligible for the Essential Plan.

Therefore, the January 23, 2018 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

You testified that you spend \$700.00 in dependent care expenses; however, these expense payments are not used to compute your adjusted gross income.

You testified that began paying student loan payments as of February 1, 2018, and that you pay \$68.00 per month. However, you did not know how much of your monthly student loan payment is applied to the interest on the loan. Only the amount equal to the interest paid by the taxpayer can be deducted from your adjusted gross income. If the entire \$68.00 payment was applied to the interest of your student loan, your expected household income would be (\$33,999.94 – (\$68.00 X 11 months)) \$33,251.94, or 204.75% of the FPL. Since this would not materially change the amount of financial assistance you are eligible to receive, your case will not be returned to NYSOH to recalculate your eligibility for financial assistance.

At the end of a tax year, a person who elects to take the APTC to help pay for the cost of an insurance premium must file a tax return and reconcile any differences between the income reported to NYSOH and the income reflected on their federal income tax return. If you received less tax credit than you were entitled to, you may receive an income tax refund.

Decision

The January 23, 2018 eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

This decision does not change your eligibility for or enrollment in health insurance coverage through NYSOH.

You were properly determined eligible to receive APTC of \$320.00 per month and eligible for CSR.

You were properly determined ineligible for the Essential Plan.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
