Legal Authority

We are sending you this notice in accordance with 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 155.545.

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Issues

The issues presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health are:

Was your qualified health plan (QHP) properly cancelled for non-payment of premiums?

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that you did not qualify to enroll in a QHP outside of the open enrollment period?

Procedural History

On November 21, 2017, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that you were eligible to purchase a QHP at full cost, effective January 1, 2018.

Also on November 21, 2017, NYSOH issued a plan enrollment notice confirming that as of November 20, 2017, you were enrolled in a QHP with an enrollment start date of January 1, 2018.

On January 26, 2018, NYSOH issued a disenrollment notice stating that your QHP coverage would end on January 1, 2018, because you did not pay your insurance bill by the payment deadline.

On February 5, 2018, your NYSOH account was updated.

Also on February 5, 2018, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and requested an appeal insofar as your QHP was terminated and you did not qualify for a special enrollment period.

On February 6, 2018, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating, in relevant part, that you did not qualify to select a health plan outside of the open enrollment period for 2018.

On April 27, 2018, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. Testimony was taken during the hearing, and the record was closed at the end of the hearing.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- 1) You testified that you are seeking to be granted a special enrollment period to enroll in a QHP.
- 2) According to your NYSOH account, on November 21, 2017, you were enrolled in a QHP with an enrollment start date of January 1, 2018.
- 3) You testified that you never receive a reminder from the health insurance company to pay your monthly health insurance premium.
- 4) According to your NYSOH account, the plan initiated termination of your coverage on January 25, 2018.
- 5) You testified that you made your January 2018 premium payment at the end of January 2018.
- 6) According to your NYSOH account, on February 5, 2018, you applied for a special enrollment period.
- 7) According to your NYSOH account and testimony, your employersponsored insurance ended as of October 1, 2017.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Appealable Issues

An applicant has the right to appeal to NYSOH's Appeals Unit: (1) an eligibility determination, including the amount of advance payments of the premium tax credit and level of cost-sharing reductions; (2) a redetermination of eligibility, including the amount of advance payments of the premium tax credit and level of

cost-sharing reductions; (3) an eligibility determination for an exemption; (4) a failure by NYSOH to provide timely notice of an eligibility determination 45 CFR § 155.505; and (5) a denial of a request for a special enrollment period (45 CFR § 155.505(b)(1)(iii), 45 CFR § 155.305(b), and 45 CFR § 155.420(d)).

Open Enrollment Period

NYSOH must provide annual open enrollment periods during which time qualified individuals may enroll in a QHP and enrollees may change QHPs (45 CFR § 155.410(a)(1)).

For the benefit year beginning on January 1, 2018, the national annual open enrollment period began on November 1, 2017 and extended through December 15, 2017 (45 CFR § 155.410(e)(3)). NY State extended this enrollment period through January 31, 2018 for applications processed through NYSOH (<u>https://www.health.ny.gov/press/releases/2017/2017-09-</u>07 open enrollment dates.htm).

Special Enrollment Periods

After each open enrollment period ends, NYSOH provides special enrollment periods to qualified individuals. During a special enrollment period, a qualified individual may enroll in a qualified health plan, and an enrollee may change their enrollment to another plan. This is generally permitted when one of the following triggering events occur:

(1) The qualified individual or his or her dependent either:

(i) Loses minimum essential coverage.

(ii) Is enrolled in any non-calendar year group health plan or individual health insurance coverage, even if the qualified individual or his or her dependent has the option to renew such coverage.

(iii) Loses pregnancy-related coverage.

(iv) Loses medically needy coverage as described under section 1902(a)(10)(C) of the Social Security Act only once per calendar year.

(2) The qualified individual gains a dependent or becomes a dependent through marriage, birth, adoption, placement for adoption, or placement in foster care, or through a child support order or other court order.

(ii) the enrollee loses a dependent or is no longer considered a dependent through divorce or legal separation as defined by State

law in the State in which the divorce or legal separation occurs, or if the enrollee, or his or her dependent, dies.

(3) The qualified individual, or his or her dependent, becomes newly eligible for enrollment in a qualified health plan because he or she gains citizenship, status as a national, or lawful present or is no longer incarcerated.

(4) The qualified individual's or his or her dependent's, enrollment or nonenrollment in a qualified health plan is unintentional, inadvertent, or erroneous and is the result of the error, misrepresentation, misconduct, or inaction of an officer, employee, or agent of NYSOH, its instrumentalities, or a non-NYSOH entity providing enrollment assistance or conducting enrollment activities.

(5) The enrollee or, his or her dependent adequately demonstrates to NYSOH that the qualified health plan in which he or she is enrolled substantially violated a material provision of its contract in relation to the enrollee;

(6) The enrollee or enrollee's dependent is newly eligible or ineligible for advance payments of the premium tax credit, or change in eligibility for cost-sharing reductions.

(7) The qualified individual or enrollee, or his or her dependent, gains access to new qualified health plan as a result of a permanent move and either—

(i) Had minimum essential coverage for one or more days during the 60 days preceding the date of the permanent move, or

(ii) Was living outside of the United States or in a United States territory at the time of the permanent move;

(8) The qualified individual or dependent who gains or maintains status as an Indian may enroll in a qualified health plan or change from one plan to another, once per month.

(9) The qualified individual or enrollee, or his or her dependent, demonstrates to the Exchange, in accordance with guidelines issued by HHS, that the individual meets other exceptional circumstances as the Exchange may provide;

(10) A qualified individual or enrollee—

(i) Is a victim of domestic abuse or spousal abandonment, including a dependent or unmarried victim within a household, is enrolled in minimum essential coverage and seeks to enroll in coverage separate from the perpetrator of the abuse or abandonment; or

(ii) Is a dependent of a victim of domestic abuse or spousal abandonment, on the same application as the victim, may enroll in coverage at the same time as the victim;

(11) A qualified individual or dependent—

(i) Applies for coverage through NYSOH during the annual open enrollment period or due to a qualifying event, is assessed as potentially eligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus and is determined ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus either after open enrollment has ended or more than 60 days after the qualifying event; or

(ii) Applies for coverage at their Local Department of Social Services or Human Resources Administration during the annual open enrollment period, and is determined ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus after open enrollment has ended;

(12) The qualified individual or enrollee, or his or her dependent, adequately demonstrates to NYSOH that a material error related to plan benefits, service area, or premium influenced the qualified individual's or enrollee's decision to purchase a qualified health plan; or

(13) At the option of NYSOH, the qualified individual provides satisfactory documentary evidence to verify his or her eligibility for an insurance affordability program or enrollment following termination of enrollment due to a failure to verify such status within 90 days.

(45 CFR § 155.420(d)).

Generally, if a triggering life event occurs, the qualified individual or enrollee has 60 days from the date of a triggering event to select a qualified health plan (45 CFR § 155.420(c)(1)).

However, a loss of health insurance coverage such as that referenced above does not include,

"voluntary termination of coverage or other loss due to-

(1) Failure to pay premiums on a timely basis, including COBRA premiums prior to expiration of COBRA coverage, or

(2) Situations allowing for a rescission as specified in 45 CFR [§] 147.128" such as failure to comply with other requirements (45 CFR § 147.128(b))

(45 CFR § 155.420(e)).

Length of Special Enrollment Period

Generally, a qualified individual or enrollee has 60 days from the date of a triggering event to select a QHP (45 CFR §155.420(c)(1)). A qualified individual or their dependent, who loses health insurance that is considered to be minimum essential coverage, has 60 days before or after the loss of coverage to select a QHP (45 CFR §155.420(c)(2)).

Legal Analysis

The first issue under review is whether your QHP was properly cancelled for nonpayment of premiums.

The record reflects that you enrolled in a QHP, through Fidelis Care, effective January 1, 2018. You testified that you never received a reminder from the health insurance company to pay your monthly health insurance premium.

The record reflects that Fidelis Care initiated termination of your coverage on January 25, 2018. On January 26, 2018, NYSOH issued you a disenrollment notice stating that your coverage would end January 1, 2018, because you did not pay your insurance bill by the payment deadline. You testified that you made your January 2018 premium payment at the end of January 2018.

NYSOH Appeals Unit only has the authority to review issues related to the following: (1) an eligibility determination, including the amount of advance payments of the premium tax credit and level of cost-sharing reductions, (2) a redetermination of eligibility, including the amount of advance payments of the premium tax credit and level of cost-sharing reductions, (3) an eligibility determination for an exemption, (4) a failure to provide timely notice of an eligibility determination and (5) a denial of a special enrollment period.

Since the Appeals Unit is not given the authority to review termination of enrollment due to non-payment of premiums, we cannot reach the merits as to whether or not you were properly terminated from your health plan for nonpayment of premiums. Therefore, your appeal regarding whether your QHP was properly cancelled for non-payment of premiums is DISMISSED.

The second issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that you did not qualify to enroll in a QHP outside of the open enrollment period.

NYSOH provided an open enrollment period from November 1, 2017 until January 31, 2018. Once the annual open enrollment period ends, a health plan enrollee must qualify for a special enrollment period in order to enroll in, or change to another health plan offered in NYSOH. To qualify for a special enrollment period, a person must experience a triggering event.

The record reflects that, on November 21, 2017, you were enrolled in a QHP with an enrollment start date of January 1, 2018. However, your QHP was terminated as of January 1, 2018, because the health insurance premium was not paid.

Generally, the loss of health insurance coverage is a basis for which a special enrollment period can be granted. The loss of health insurance coverage in this case cannot be considered a triggering event for a special enrollment period since the coverage ended because you failed to pay your health insurance premium, which NYSOH considers a voluntary action that caused the termination of your coverage.

A qualified individual or their dependent, who loses health insurance that is minimum essential coverage, has 60 days before or after the loss of coverage to select a QHP.

The record reflects that your employer-sponsored insurance ended as of October 1, 2017. Further, you applied for a special enrollment period on February 5, 2018. The 60-day special enrollment period that began on October 1, 2017, expired on November 30, 2017. Therefore, you did not qualify for a special enrollment period because you lost your employer-sponsored insurance.

The credible evidence of record indicates that after January 31, 2018, you have not experienced a triggering event that would qualify you for a special enrollment period.

Therefore, the February 6, 2018, eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

Decision

Your appeal regarding whether your QHP was properly cancelled for nonpayment of premiums is DISMISSED. The February 6, 2018, eligibility determination notice is AFFIRMED.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

You did not qualify for a special enrollment period as of February 5, 2018, nor as of the date of this Decision.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
