Issue

The issue presented for review by the Appeals Unit of NY State of Health is:

Did NY State of Health (NYSOH) properly determine that your eligibility for Medicaid and your enrollment in your Medicaid Managed Care plan ended, effective January 31, 2018?

Procedural History

On December 21, 2017, NYSOH issued an eligibility determination notice stating that you were conditionally eligible for Medicaid, effective January 1, 2018. The notice directed you to provide documentation confirming your household's income before January 4, 2018 in order to confirm your eligibility for financial assistance.

Also on December 21, 2017, NYSOH issued a notice confirming your enrollment in a Medicaid Managed Care plan with a plan enrollment start date of January 1, 2018.

On January 16, 2018, NYSOH issued a discontinuance notice stating that you were no longer eligible for health insurance through NYSOH. The notice stated that you did not qualify for health coverage through NYSOH because NYSOH did not receive the income documentation needed to verify the income listed in your application. This eligibility was effective February 1, 2018.

Also on January 16, 2018, NYSOH issued a disenrollment notice stating that your enrollment in your Medicaid Managed Care plan would end as of January

31, 2018, because you were no longer eligible to enroll in health insurance through NYSOH.

On February 6, 2018, you updated your application for financial assistance. That day, a preliminary eligibility determination was prepared stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan.

Also on February 6, 2018, you spoke to NYSOH's Account Review Unit and appealed insofar as you were without coverage for the month of February 2018.

On February 7, 2018, NYSOH issued a notice of eligibility determination, based on your February 6, 2018 application, stating that you were eligible to enroll in the Essential Plan, effective March 1, 2018.

On February 17, 2018, NYSOH issue a notice of enrollment confirmation, stating that you were enrolled in an Essential Plan effective March 1, 2018.

On April 17, 2018, you had a telephone hearing with a Hearing Officer from NYSOH's Appeals Unit. The record was developed during the hearing and closed at the end of the hearing.

Findings of Fact

A review of the record supports the following findings of fact:

- You testified, and your NYSOH account confirms, that you receive all of your notices from NYSOH by electronic mail.
- You testified that you did not receive any electronic alerts notifying you of any notice in your NYSOH account stating that your eligibility was only conditional and that you needed to provide documentation of your income.
- 3) Your NYSOH account indicates that on January 15, 2018 your application was run and you were found no longer eligible to enroll in health insurance through NYSOH effective February 1, 2018.
- You testified that you did not know there was a problem with your coverage until a coverage until a coverage. You explained that you had a doctor's appointment scheduled for you received a call from the doctor's office advising you that you did not have active coverage.
- 5) You updated the income information in your NYSOH account on February 6, 2018.

- 6) You testified that you are seeking coverage for the month of February 2018.
- 7) NYSOH uploaded an evidence packet to your NYSOH account. Contained within that evidence packet under the heading of "electronic notice requirement" is a three-page memorandum dated August 21, 2017. The memorandum sets forth the federal requirements regarding use of electronic communications and asserts that NYSOH is in compliance with federal regulation and guidance on the use of electronic notices. The memorandum asserts that "the electronic notification rules do not require that exchanges track and monitor consumers actual receipt of electronic notices".
- 8) NYSOH has submitted no evidence that an electronic alert was sent to you regarding the December 21, 2017 eligibility determination notice.

Conflicting evidence, if any, was considered and found to be less credible than the evidence noted above.

Applicable Law and Regulations

Verification of Eligibility for Medicaid

Medicaid can be provided through NYSOH to adults who: (1) are age 19 or older and under age 65, (2) are not pregnant, (3) are not entitled to or enrolled for Medicare benefits under part A or B of title XVIII of the Act, (4) are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled for mandatory coverage under a State's Medicaid State plan in accordance with subpart B of this part, and (5) have a household modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) that is at or below 138% of the FPL for the applicable family size (42 CFR § 435.119(b), 42 CFR § 435.911(b)(1), 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4)), NY Social Services Law § 366(1)(b)).

For all individuals whose income is needed to calculate the household's eligibility, NYSOH must request data that will allow NYSOH to verify the household's income (45 CFR §155.320(c)(1)(i), 42 CFR § 435.945).

If NYSOH cannot verify the income information required to determine eligibility they must attempt to resolve the inconsistency including giving the applicant the opportunity to submit satisfactory documentary evidence (45 CFR §155.315(f) 42 CFR § 435.952).

NYSOH cannot terminate eligibility for Medicaid unless NYSOH has sought additional information from an applicant and provided proper notice (45 CFR §435.952(d)).

Essential Plan

NYSOH must generally determine an applicant eligible for the Essential Plan, a basic health plan, if the person is (1) a resident of New York State, (2) expects to have a household income between 138% and 200% of the applicable federal poverty level (FPL) or, in the case of an individual who is a lawfully present noncitizen who is ineligible for Medicaid or Child Health Plus as a result of their immigration status, has a household income that is between 0% and 200% of the FPL, (3) is not otherwise eligible for minimum essential coverage except through the individual market, (4) is 64 years old or younger, (5) is a citizen or a lawfully present non-citizen, and (6) is not incarcerated (see 42 CFR § 600.305, 42 CFR § 435.603(d)(4), 45 CFR § 155.305(e), NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(3), 42 USC § 18051).

For individuals seeking enrollment in an Essential Plan, New York State has elected to follow the same rules that NYSOH uses in determining effective dates for individuals seeking enrollment in qualified health plans (NY Social Services Law § 369-gg(4)(c); New York's Basic Health Plan Blueprint, p. 16, as approved January 2016; see https://www.medicaid.gov/basic-health-program/downloads/ny-blueprint.pdf).

The effective date of coverage by an Essential Plan is determined by the date on which an applicant selects a plan for enrollment. For individuals who are eligible for enrollment, NYSOH must generally ensure that coverage is effective the first day of the following month for selections received by NYSOH from the first to the fifteenth of any month (45 CFR §§ 155.410(f)(2), 155.420(b)(1)(i); see also 42 CFR § 600.320). For selections received by NYSOH from the sixteenth to the last day of any month, NYSOH must ensure coverage is effective the first day of the second following month (45 CFR §§ 155.410(f)(2), 155.420(b)(1)(ii)).

Electronic Notices

Applicants may choose to receive notices and information from NYSOH either by electronic alerts or by regular mail. If the applicant elects to receive electronic notices, NYSOH must send an email or other electronic communication alerting the individual that a notice has been posted to the applicant's account (42 CFR § 600.330(e); 42 CFR § 435.918(b)(4)).

Additionally, if an electronic alert regarding a notice in an individual's NYSOH account fails, NYSOH must send out the notice by regular mail within three days of the failed alert (42 CFR § 435.918(b)(5)).

Legal Analysis

The issue under review is whether NYSOH properly determined that your eligibility for Medicaid and your enrollment in your Medicaid managed Care plan ended, effective January 31, 2018.

An individual requesting financial assistance to help pay for the cost of coverage provided through NYSOH is required to attest to his or her household's projected annual income, NYSOH must request income data from data sources in order to verify an individual's income attestation.

If NYSOH cannot verify an individual's attestation, it must provide the individual the opportunity to submit satisfactory documentary evidence.

In the eligibility determination issued on December 21, 2017, you were advised that you were conditionally eligible for Medicaid, and that you needed to confirm your household's income before January 4, 2018.

The record reflects that NYSOH did not receive the requested income documentation before the deadline.

However, you testified and the record reflects that you elected to receive alerts regarding notices from NYSOH electronically. Although NYSOH contends that it complied with federal mandates regarding electronic notices, there is no evidence in the file that NYSOH sent you an electronic alert notifying you of a new notice available in your account on December 21, 2017. You credibly testified that you did not receive an electronic alert regarding the eligibility determination notice, which directed you that your eligibility was limited and that you needed to submit documentation to confirm the household income in your application. There is also no evidence in your account documenting that any email alert was sent to you regarding the notice, that any such electronic alert failed, or that the notice was later sent to you by regular mail.

NYSOH is required to send applicants proper notice in order for applicants to take appropriate action. Since there is no evidence that NYSOH sent you an email alert, and you testified that you did not receive one, there is insufficient evidence in the record that NYSOH provided you by electronic means with proper notice that you needed to submit documentation of your household income.

Since you were not made aware of and did not receive proper notice that there was an inconsistency in your NYSOH account, the January 16, 2018 discontinuance notice and January 16, 2018 disenrollment notice, stating that you are no longer eligible for Medicaid and disenrolled from your Medicaid Managed Care plan because you failed to submit documentation are RESCINDED.

Your case is RETURNED to NYSOH to reinstate your coverage in your Medicaid Managed Care plan from February 1, 2018 through February 28, 2018.

Decision

The January 16, 2018 discontinuance notice is RESCINDED.

The January 16, 2018 disenrollment notice is RESCINDED.

Your case is RETURNED to NYSOH to reinstate your coverage in your Medicaid Managed Care plan from February 1, 2018 to February 28, 2018.

How this Decision Affects Your Eligibility

NYSOH erred in terminating your Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care plan effective January 31, 2018, without the proper notice.

Your case is being sent back to NYSOH to reinstate your coverage in your Medicaid Managed Care plan from February 1, 2018 to February 28, 2018.

If You Disagree with this Decision (Appeal Rights)

This Decision is final unless you submit an appeal request to the Federal Marketplace or bring a lawsuit under New York Civil Practice Law and Rules, Article 78.

You may bring a lawsuit on any Appeals Unit decision in New York State court in accordance with Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules. This must be done within four months of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision.

Additionally, Appeals Unit decisions on issues involving eligibility for qualified health plans, advance premium tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions may be appealed to the Federal Marketplace. This must be done within 30 days of the Decision Date, which appears on the first page of this Decision (45 CFR § 155.520(c)).
